The southwest corner of West Walker has recently been the target of both – and during daylight hours. With incidents on the rise in West Walker, this is a great time to consider forming a Block Club on your block. The 17th District offers Block Club training each month. The Special Events Committee has another great event scheduled for this month – the 2nd Annual Build A Bag event on Sunday, April 22nd at the Irving Park Lutheran Church gym. Bring any new or unused travel-sized toiletries to the event, plus handbags or shaving kits and we'll put them together for the people served by the Irving Park Community Food Pantry. Build A Bag is a great way to meet new people, reconnect with neighbors and provide a valuable service. So bring the kids, enjoy some refreshments and Build A Bag!

The Safe Neighborhoods Committee's **Anne Marie O'Kelley** and **Martina Gombas** joined me in meeting with **Alderman Laurino**, **Commander Dulay** of the 17th District and a traffic engineer from the City. Strategies to relieve speeding on Hamlin were discussed, along with better traffic flow at Tony's Market and stop sign enforcement. Future meetings are planned to discuss our options.

Alderman Laurino believes strongly that traffic problems are solved through a three-pronged effort – dubbed the Three Es – engineering, enforcement and education. Please take some time to evaluate your own driving habits and review the rules of the road. For instance, the speed limit on all Chicago streets is 30 miles per hour, unless otherwise posted. And stop signs, despite popular opinion, are not optional. You can expect to see better enforcement of speed limits and stop signs in our area, so beware!

Thanks to *Wire* editor **Beth Tigue**, who has put together another great newsletter, and to all our carriers. Special thanks to **Glenda Begeske** for her service, and to **Diane Zito** who has recently joined the ranks. Substitutes are always needed -- phone **Bob Begeske** at 267-5942 if you'd like to help.

Former board member **Jane Nagle** has agreed to serve as head of this year's nominating committee. If you're interested in serving as an officer of the Board, please call Jane at 588-1926. A slate will be presented in May, followed by officer elections in June.

West Walker Civic Association - General Meeting Minutes March 20, 2007 - 20 present

WWCA President Liz Mills opened the meeting at 7:36 pm.

The first order of business was a talk by George Santiago, V.P. and Branch Executive of the First Chicago Bank & Trust (formerly Labe Bank). Mr. Santiago spoke about the Bank's desire to continue the 100 year history of Community involvement which was part of Labe Bank. The plan for a new bank building and commercial space at Elston & Pulaski was discussed, although a final plan is not ready to be presented. Mr. Santiago encouraged neighbors to visit the Bank. Questions regarding bank services, from the proof department, which counts deposits, to changes in consumer accounts were answered.

Also on the program was John Borovicka, the District Director for U.S. Congressman Rahm Emanuel's 5th Congressional District office. The Congressman represents 675,000 people and is now in his third term. Issues handled by the office include all services offered by the Federal government, such as income tax assistance, social security, passports and veteran's affairs. The Congressman is head of the Democratic Caucus and on the Ways and Means Committee. Local programs include Rahm's Readers, for young readers and the "Congressman on your Corner" where the Congressman goes to local venues to meet his constituents. The Congressman is working on children's health legislation as well as clean lakes and prescription medication access measures.

The February General Meeting Minutes were approved.

Treasurer Bob Begeske reported a general account balance of \$2,451.35. Bob also reported that additional Wire carrier volunteers are needed.

Liz Mills reported on the success of the Winter Social, which drew 60 people out on one of the wintriest nights of the year.

The Vision Committee is participating in the Creative Chicago Expo on April 21. This is an effort by the City to match neighborhoods with various artistic and creative people and organizations.

Liz Mills reported that there is a proposal for development of the old C. Manny's property at 4154 N. Elston, which will be reviewed and considered in cooperation with the Alderman's Office in the near future.

Bob Begeske reported on the recent CAPS meeting and the need for more volunteers to attend meetings to collect the report and relay it to the Monthly WWCA meetings.

The West Walker second annual Build-a-Bag gathering to benefit the Irving Park Community Food Pantry will be rescheduled. (Editor's note: The new date is Sunday, April 22nd.)

May 19, 2007 is the date for the 22nd Annual WWCA Garage Sale.

The May General Meeting will include updates on summer programs from the Independence Library Branch and Independence Park on their summer programs.

Also in May will be the formation of the Nominating Committee to recommend Officers for next year. All interested in participating should talk to any Board Member or Officer.

A neighbor talked about the new business in the commercial building on Elston Ave. at Avers Ave., That Strip Joynt. The neighbor has detected noxious odors coming from the building, which is a wood refinishing business. The Dept. of the Environment and Alderman Laurino's office have been contacted. West Walker will arrange a meeting with the business owner and Alderman Laurino's office.

Make A Contract With Your Teen

Sometimes it's best to have something in writing that will spell out parents' expectations and teen's rules. Here is a sample contract. Note that many experts recommend putting written penalties next to each agreement.



TEEN DRIVING CONTRACT					
I,, agree to the terms of this contract allowing me the privilege of driving. If I violate this agreement, I will forfeit my driving privilege to the extent and degree of the violation.					
I WILL:					
() wear my safety belt at all times, when driving or riding as a passenger;					
() require that every passenger wear a safety belt;					
() keep my doors locked while driving;					
() always drive at safe speeds for the conditions — at or below the speed limit;					
() obey traffic laws.					
I WILL NOT:					
() drive under the influence of alcohol or other drugs;					
() be a passenger in a car driven by someone under the influence of alcohol or other drugs;					
() allow alcohol or other drugs, or weapons in the car;					
() engage in thrill-seeking, stunts, or any form of racing;					
() conceal any tickets, warnings, or collisions from parents/guardians;					
() allow anyone else to drive the car;					
() allow passengers, other than parents, until that privilege is given by my parents.

CAPS Update: Beat 1723

CAPS (Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy) meetings for 2007 for our beat are held at the 17th District in the community Room, 4650 N. Pulaski. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. monthly on the 3rd Wednesday and typically last one hour.

Florence Stoller, the CAPS facilitator for Beat 1723 mentioned that she is to testify about adding cameras to key alleys. Ms.

Stoller also said parking problems and suspicious activity continues to take place, reinforcing the need for the cameras to be installed. The police said they will continue to cite violators for parking in the alleys illegally.

A burglary occurred on Monday, March 26 in the 4100 block of Springfield around 11:00 a.m. The person entered the house by cutting a screen on the side porch and stole a purse. A neighbor saw the man put the screen in the back by the alley with no particular sense of urgency so she thought he was a worker. The following is a description of the burglar: male, white or Hispanic, approximately 20-30 years old, between 5'8" or 5' 10" with very dark hair. He was wearing a beige baseball cap and a blue striped shirt. There was also another burglary earlier in the month in the 4100 block of Springfield, but additional details are not available.

As always, be vigilant about keeping doors locked when you are outside or away from home and call 911



to report any suspicious people or activity in your neighborhood.

On Sunday, April 1, about a dozen garages in the vicinity of Springfield/ Avers/Harding and Belle Plaine were "tagged" with graffiti. The Alderman's office recommended that everyone who was tagged call the [Alderman's] office to file a report and request the Graffiti Blasters

(if they don't want to paint themselves). The Alderman also recommended that homeowners affected call 311 to file a police report as this will make the issue more prominent with the police and increase our visibility. At this point, the graffiti does not appear to be gangrelated.

A meeting with the 17th district commander and Alderman Laurino took place on April 4 to discuss traffic enforcement in West Walker, and all of these recent incidents were added to the agenda.

The next CAPS FREE Block Club training will be held on April 21st at the 7th district station community room at 4560 N. Pulaski from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. For more information on Block Club training, contact Chris Wright at (312) 742-0961 or email christopher.wright@chicagopolice.org.


