45th Ward Report



The Department of Streets and Sanitation begin their residential street cleaning schedule in April and will run through mid-November. The city hangs bright orange temporary parking restrictions the day before sweeping service is scheduled to begin. Those who fail to move their vehicle between the restricted hours, between 9 am and 2 pm, may receive a \$60 ticket. The street sweeping schedule is available to view at the 45th Ward Map (https://tinyurl.com/ybsh59ja). This

CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 Meeting March 21, 2018

Important Notice: As of January 2018, Beat 1722/1723 CAPS meeting will start at 7:00 pm. **Present:** CAPS Officer Zanders, CAPS Coordinator Martha Hack

CAPS Officer Zanders started the meeting by asking for any old business. Hearing none, he introduced two employees of Erie Neighborhood House, a 148 year old agency assisting immigrants in Chicago communities.

In new business, Officer Zanders talked about 9-10 robberies which occurred over a short period of time in the 17th, 20th and 24th Districts on March 19th. Two juveniles have been arrested and it's hoped that two other individuals involved will be arrested soon. The victims were physically unharmed. On March 18th, a shooting occurred in the 4300 block of Monticello. The shooting doesn't appear to be gang related and may have been a result of road rage. No arrests have been made.

An inquiry was made about a series of criminal damage to vehicles and property made in the 4000-4100 blocks of

Harding and Springfield and vicinity in early March. Officer Zanders reported that two were damage to garages, and a few others were criminal damage to vehicles. Two arrests were made: one was a domestic related arrest, and the other was a road rage incident. The other incidents appear to be unrelated. Always lock your car doors and never leave valuables in your vehicles. Don't leave bikes or any other valuables unlocked in your garage.

An inquiry was made about the legality of a dumpster in the 3700 block of W. Berteau. The Alderman's office has been notified.

Officer Zanders reported that Commander Susan Moss (17th Dist.), is trying to get more officers in the 17th District.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood. Provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, April 18.

Carlson's After-School Program Hosts buildOn

The Magic After-School
Place has a long-standing
relationship with Schurz High
School's buildOn mentoring
program. That relationship was
taken to a new level in midMarch when adult supporters
of buildOn from Rodan &
Fields visited MAP as part of
buildOn's 36 Hours immersive
experience. Approximately
30 people from across the US
were visiting to "walk in the

shoes" of buildOn students and serve with them over the course of 36 hours. Typically, buildOn mentors spend time with MAP students helping with homework, leading games and promoting leadership skills among the older students. But for the 36 Hours visitors, Rachel Lockhart, MAP Director, recognized an opportunity to do an activity that required a lot of adult volunteers.

"I had seen that a 'sport' called hobbyhorsing is really popular with kids in Finland," said Rachel. "And it looked really fun, so I created the Hobby Horse Challenge for the buildOn visitors. We had a blast!" The Hobby Horse Challenge featured MAP kids riding on stick hobby horses performing equestrian moves like steeple chase and dressage. Every age group participated with great enthusiasm proving that there's always something fun going on at MAP!

The Magic After-School Place serves students in kindergarten through 8th grade from Belding and Murphy Schools. The program serves 60 children from predominately low-income households. MAP is a program of Carlson Community Services, a neighborhood non-profit with a mission to connect the Irving Park community with programs that enrich lives through education, culture and service. Pantry Plans Neighborhood Walk for May 19th

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry is organizing a walk through the Old Irving Park neighborhood, in the vicinity of the Pantry. The goal is to raise funds for the Pantry and generate awareness for the Pantry's efforts in our community. The walk will take place at 9 a.m. on Saturday, May 19th, and we can begin to assemble for the walk at 8:15. A route of about 1.7 miles through the neighborhood has been mapped out and approved by the city. It should take about 30 to 40 minutes to complete the route.

Our goal is to raise awareness about food insecurity in our neighborhood, which includes the 60641 and western half of 60618 ZIP codes. We will be asking walkers to ask their friends for pledges and trying to raise money to help us buy food for clients, as our client base continues to grow in these difficult times for those in need. We encourage school and church groups to gather to walk together. Students can earn 2 hours of service time for participating. Thank you to Liberty Tax Service on Irving Park Road, for its March promotion that benefitted the Pantry by discounting their tax-prep fees by 50% for everyone who makes a \$20 donation. The program ran through March 31st. It followed a February program in which Liberty donated \$5 to the Pantry for every form prepared.

We also want to thank Pet Supplies Plus and its various neighborhood locations for its strong support of our Pet Food Corner with large donations on a weekly basis. Thanks also to Susan and Randy Patke as well as Barb Carlson and Marjorie Pomonis, who organize and deliver the donations.

The Pantry continues to offer free weekly bloodpressure screenings to our clients. The program runs in cooperation with Presence Resurrection Medical Group, Advocate Lutheran General Hospital and the American Heart Association.

The Pantry's nutrition class, in cooperation with Dominican University, has begun a new group of weekly instruction courses, under the direction of student Emily Scheinman.




