

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

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CAPS Report

April 18, 2012 - Beat #1723

Citizens reported repeated attempts to steal downspouts from garages. These attempted thefts involve people traveling in pick-up trucks collecting junk (except they are trying to detach metal from garages). Be aware that such activity is occurring and report anything suspicious. If the activity is in progress, call 911 and report the location, type of vehicle, physical descriptions of participants, etc.

There were reports of potential drug sales occurring at certain locations on the 4100 block of Monticello and the 3700 block of Hamlin. Please report any suspicious activity.

Longer wait times for graffiti removal will result due to the new grid-system. Commander Staples met with the Police Commissioner and Aldermen to devise a plan for the removal of gang-related graffiti in a shorter period of time; ideally, within 1 to 3 days of the graffiti being reported. Please continue to report graffiti to: (1) 311 for graffiti removal (remember to ask for a tracking number so you follow up on the status if the removal is not completed) and (2) the 17th District CAPS Office (CAPS.017district@chicagopolice.org) by sending a photo of the graffiti along with the address or location so the graffiti can be logged in its database. Also, copy your Alderman's office on the email so both the Alderman and the CAPS Office will determine if the graffiti is gang-related and put in a special request for faster removal.

NOTE: The May 16 CAPS meeting for Beat 1723 has been cancelled due to the NATO conference and other events occurring at that time. Subject to the preceding sentence, CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, June 20. If you should have any issues between beat meetings, please feel free to contact the CAPS office.

39th Ward Report



Dear Neighbor,
My 39th Ward Electronics Recycling Event is Saturday, May 19. From 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. at Northeastern Illinois University, Parking Lot L (just west of St. Louis, between Foster and Bryn Mawr). This is the perfect opportunity to drop off old computers, televisions, DVD players, fax machines, cell

phones, and video equipment. Materials will be safely and securely recycled by Sims Recycling Solutions. Last year's event was very popular, resulting in the collection and recycling of 21,000 pounds of electronics.

April was a busy month for my Committee on Pedestrian and Traffic Safety. The speed camera, children safety zone ordinance garnered considerable media attention. After weighing the pros and cons of the legislation, I voted in favor of the ordinance. I did not take this vote lightly. Let me explain my thoughts.

As with every vote I take in the City Council, I considered how the legislation would impact the residents of and locations in the 39th Ward. I agree with those who say that speed humps are an effective deterrent to speeding around our 39th Ward schools. However, we have had some serious speeding issues at locations around parks and schools located on busy streets where speed humps cannot be installed. In my years as Alderman, I have witnessed the repercussions of accidents on these streets, ranging from fender benders to crashes (in a few cases, a car into a house) to death. I hope to never see this again. My memories of these accidents were at the forefront of my mind when I voted for this legislation.

We have tried other methods to reducing vehicular speed. The 17th District Police has assigned officers with radar guns to these locations, but they cannot be stationed on the streets permanently and the problems continue.

I recognize that the speed cameras are not a panacea for solving the problems of speeding vehicular traffic, but this gives the city one more tool to control speeding. I will also not deny that the city will collect revenue on speeding tickets. My hope, however, is that the addition of the cameras will help change the culture of speeding, particularly around schools and parks. I know that this might be a tall order, but the alternative to doing nothing at these locations is simply not an option.

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

Join the Food Pantry's Hunger Walk on June 23rd The 27th annual Hunger Walk, sponsored by the Greater Chicago Food Depository, will take place on June 23rd at Soldier Field. Registration begins at 7 a.m. and walkers step off at 8:30 a.m. The Irving Park Community Food Pantry (IPCFP) will

benefit directly from your participation, as donations can be made directly to the Pantry or through the Depository to us, using our account number (#A00113).

The event consists of a 5K (3.2-mile) walk along the lakefront. Participants don't even have to walk -- they just have to show up for registration! You can support the Hunger Walk in three ways:

- Organize a Hunger Walk Team of at least 10 walkers. Each walker signs up pledges to sponsor their walk.
- Join the Team. Individuals can join the Pantry's walkers and raise funds. For every walker we have up to 30, the Pantry receives a higher percentage of funds raised by the Depository in general.
- Donate to a Hunger Walk Team. Sign a walker's pledge sheet, bring a donation to the Pantry office or donate online at the Hunger Walk site (see below).

More details will be available on the Pantry's Facebook page and in mailings closer to the walk. Last year's walk raised the most money ever for the Pantry. We hope to do even better this year!

Disney II Magnet School

Disney II Magnet was the site of a press-conference where Mayor Rahm Emanuel and CEO of Chicago Public Schools,

Jean-Claude Brizard announced the new "Seven Hour School Day," to begin next fall. Disney II Magnet was one of the pioneers of the extended day and has witnessed first-hand its success. We are so proud of Principal Chkoumbova, the staff and parents for their dedication and hard work to make Disney II academically successful.

Our traffic committee is hard at work to alleviate congestion around the school. We have a parent in charge of traffic patrol, who has been alerting parents not to double-park or block street corners. Other ways we will address the issue include: Continual reminders to parents about safe pick-up/drop-off; Extra patrols on street corners; Intermittent police presence; Incoming kindergarten families receive traffic procedure orientation; Incoming 6th graders to be trained as crossing guard patrols in the fall; Working with the Alderman on altering traffic flow patterns on Kedvale. Interesting to note: While Disney II grows each year, the growth is in about 25 new families, with half of each new class comprised of siblings. Many families have

formed car pools, which is convenient for them, and greatly improves traffic in the area.
