# 45th Ward Report



Beginning early September, the Department of Water Management (DWM) and NPL Construction Co. crews will begin the work to install 2,615 feet of 8-inch water main on North Keeler from West Montrose to West Irving Park. The water main along this stretch of road has been identified as being over 100-years-old

and needs to be replaced.

When crews are working in the street, they may close or limit it to traffic for safety reasons. However, residents will always be able to reach their homes or businesses. Outside of working hours, a travel lane will be left open for local traffic only.

"No Parking" signs will be posted as needed during working hours (generally 7 am to 4 pm). Parking outside of those hours will be allowed, but cars will need to be moved by the start of the next workday. Crews will try to preserve as much parking as possible.

DWM and my office understand that construction always involves inconveniences and noise. Crews will do everything possible to maintain residents' quality of life throughout these projects, and will conduct themselves as good and thoughtful neighbors in the course of their presence on your street.

Should you have any questions or concerns, you can either ask the construction foreman on the project site, email my office at Ward45@CityofChicago.org, or call the DWM Office of Public Affairs at 312-744-6638.

The water main installation is anticipated to be completed by late November 2018. Once the water main is installed, the street will be restored so that traffic is not impacted. However, final restoration is weather dependent and may not occur until the spring of 2019 or until weather permits.

Thank you for your ongoing patience as these important infrastructure improvements are completed.

# Your Property Assessment is Up 40%. Yikes! What Can You Do?

Hi Neighbors. Many of you asked me what to do about the big property tax assessment increase. The first step was to file an appeal to the Cook County Assessor by August 16. If you missed our Jefferson Township deadline, here are some additional options even if you already appealed to the Assessor.

**1. File a complaint with the Cook County Board of Review** during the 30 days when Jefferson Township opens up. (Date is TBD). Go to www. cookcountyboardofreview.com.

**2. File an appeal with the Illinois Property Tax Appeal Board (PTAB).** After doing #1 above, you can further appeal to PTAB – www.ptab.illinois.gov.

**3. Make sure you are getting all your property exemptions.** There are 8 exemptions that reduce your assessment & your taxes --Homeowner, Senior, Veteran and even one for Home Improvement.

There are specific rules & deadlines. File yourself or hire an attorney. Feel free to call or email me for a recommendation.

# **CAPS Report**

# Beats 1722 & 1723 Meeting August 15, 2018

In attendance: Martha Hack, CAPS Facilitator, CAPS Officer Hamid, CAPS Officer Zander, Ald. Deb Mell (33rd Ward), Alderman Carlos Ramirez-Rosa's Office (35th Ward), Gail Beitz, Alderman Laurino's Office (39th Ward).

About 45-50 residents attended the meeting. Both Alderman Mell and Ramirez-Rosa were at the meeting and briefly spoke about recent violence and public safety. Mell urged residents to report suspicious activity and street lights that are broken or out. Two Albany Park murders in August (outside of Beat 1723) were discussed briefly. A 19-year-old man was killed on Aug 2nd and the police think it was mistaken identity on the part of the shooters. They are not considering it gang related since the victim was not in a gang. The other murder on August 13th is not believed to be related, but was definitely gang-related.

Officers warned of a "Gypsy Ruse" that occurred on August 7th, 9th and 10th, where two male Hispanics posed as utility workers wearing yellow vests to gain access to and steal from homes. The officers stressed that utility workers wear ID badges. If you are unsure of whether someone is legitimate, call 911 and officers can come out to verify.

The CAPS officers are creating a gang graffiti database. They would like pictures and addresses of gang graffiti before you call the graffiti blasters to remove the graffiti. You can contact the CAPS office at CAPS017District@ chicagopolice.org with this information.

The rest of the meeting was spent with complaints about the homeless man who has taken up residence at the corner of Central Park and Irving Park. He is adding furniture and more possessions to the area where he sleeps and is a deterrent to area businesses, some of which have just opened. In addition, other homeless people have begun spending time with him there. Complaints ranged from public urination and defecating, public intoxication, drug sales to minors and public indecency. According to the officers, he has been arrested 122 times and has refused the services of the city's health and human services office. Officers urged people

# Yard Waste Collection

In an effort to assist residents in clearing their yards, parkways and storm drains of debris, please be reminded that the Chicago Department of Streets and Sanitation has implemented a coordinated collection of yard waste debris across the City. Residents can call 311 to request separate bagged yard waste collection service throughout the season, which runs April to November.

**IMPORTANT:** Yard waste should be **bagged separately** and left in the alley or at the curb, next to black garbage carts and blue recycling carts for pickup. Yard waste and other debris should not be thrown into the blue *recycling cart* as it contaminates the recycling stream.

Call 311 to have a dedicated DSS truck collect your yard waste and take the bags to be composted in an effort to increase diversion from landfills.

# **Schurz High** School

The Schurz Community is excited to announce that construction on a new. \$2.7-million athletic field begins September 7th!

Work on the field and on Waveland, which will be narrowed once construction is finished, will take about three months. During construction, Waveland will be temporarily closed from Milwaukee to Lowell, but it will reopen to one-way traffic after work is finished. The end result will be an IHSA-regulation sized field allowing Schurz to host home soccer games for the first time in its history!

In addition to the soccer field, there will be a softball field, water fountain, and a running track. Those amenities will be open to the community during nonschool use. No buildings are planned and lighting is engineered to prevent disturbance to the surrounding areas.

Alderman Arena has announced that this project leaves a section on the east side that is not needed for the sports fields. Possible uses include an outdoor fitness trail, dog park, or outdoor classroom space. All would include natural landscaping. 
The Schurz' Parents and Family Open House is scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 20, from 5-7 pm.

In August, Schurz was awarded a grant from the Sustainable Community Schools Initiative. We look forward to our partnership with the Logan Square Neighborhood Association!


We are excited for the support of the new City Year Team led by Schurz alumna Eunice Zepeda ('13). Welcome back Eunice!


# Last "Lot Jams" of the Summer

not to give him money. That's what keeps him in that spot. They also stated that unless the police witness him doing something illegal, they cannot arrest him. Anyone who witnesses him breaking the law should report it to 911 and file a complaint.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, September 19, 2018 at 7:00 pm If you or a neighbor have been the victim of a crime and you would like to share that information with your neighbors, e-mail the details to westwalkercrimealerts@gmail.com. The exact address of the crime and name of the victim will be kept anonymous.

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
