Free Event: Intersections: 3 Generations at Stola Contemporary Art

There will be an artists' reception on **Saturday, September 18th, from 5 pm to 8 pm.** Exhibition runs September 17th through October 31st.

Intersections: 3 Generations showcases the work made by a family of artists. Each member of the Arceo family brings a unique voice to the collective while also sharing graphic and thematic interests. This exhibition juxtaposes Jose Armando Arceo's street art aesthetic with Atlan Arceo-Witzl's symbol-based visuals and Rene Arceo's magically organic hand. They employ a diverse array of media to explore their shared Mexican heritage, typography, design, community, their surrounding environment, the self, and contemporary life. They all find grounding in the creative act as they carry on this tradition. They learn from the intersections, continuing to make work that is informed and emphatically their own.

All three artists have experience with relief printmaking as well as large scale murals. Both mediums recall the influential history of artists in post-revolutionary Mexico around the turn of the 20th century. These disciplines engaged form, line, and language to tell stories, convey political ideas, and investigate the barriers between representational and abstract art. The work of the Arceo family will occasionally harken back to this history. Sometimes subtly and at other times overtly. Their work describes their life in the United States in manifold ways just like the Mexican greats and the people of Mesoamerica did in their society because that is what artists are want to do.

Is it Still a Good Time to Sell?

Yes! We are experiencing a unique real estate market where it is beneficial for sellers and buyers. Buyers are locking in historically low mortgage rates which allows them to afford a higher priced home. If we look at median sale prices & mortgage rates since 1975, and adjust for inflation, home prices in 2021 are the lowest except for 2 years in the last 45 years.

And sellers are benefiting from record increases in prices. In Irving Park, the median sale price for a 3 bedroom 2 bath home, up to 2000 sq ft, was \$429,000, up 22% in July 2021 versus July last year. CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723

July 21, 2021 - Hybrid Meeting

Zoom and In-Person

(June 16, 2021 - No Report. August 18, 2021 - Meeting Cancelled).

In Attendance: Commander Pontecore, CAPS Officer Whitherspoon, Community Organizer John Campos, Alderman Nugent (39th) Jessica from Ald. Rosa's office (35th) Marie Joyce from Alderman Gardiner's office (45th)

Officer Witherspoon reported that year-to-date, crime is down in the 17th District compared with one year ago. Homicides, shootings, motor vehicle thefts and robberies are down, but burglaries are up.

Officer Witherspoon and Commander Pontecore detailed a number of incidents of shots fired and assault in Beat 1723, most of which occurred outside of the West Walker boundaries. The Commander stated that nearly all are the result of internal gang struggles over narcotics. For the most part they are targeting each other, but innocent bystanders can be caught in the cross fire or mistaken for gang members. The Commander encouraged residents to get good descriptions of offenders and vehicles, especially license plates. For the most part the players are known, but have to be caught in the act of committing a crime.

A building in the 4400 block of Lawndale has been the subject of police enforcement. Working with the 35th ward, a third-floor apartment was raided and a substantial number of narcotics were recovered and arrests made.

Alderman Nugent thanked the 17th District officers and the Commander for the work they are doing and encouraged residents to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. She said that block party permits are being issued. The police and the Alderman ask that residents not block the streets with vehicles during block parties. Use tape instead so that emergency vehicles can get through.

The 17th District will participate in a National Night Out on 8/3 at the Salvation Army at 5020 N. Pulaski from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m.

Help Pantry with Unusual Items

With the start of our modified Client Choice program, the Irving Park Food Pantry has added Take-One tables outside. They allow us to provide clients with items needed by only some people.

The tables are popular, leading us to ask supporters to donate items. Among the most requested items are baby wipes, laundry detergent, child and adult diapers, sunscreen, washcloths, men's white crew socks, lip balm, children's books and toiletries (deodorant, toothpaste and brushes, razors and shaving cream and body wash).

The Pantry has welcomed Marcy Sherrill to the Board of Directors. An energy attorney for the Illinois Commerce Commission, she is vice chair of the board at Carlson Community Services and served as president of the Hands to Help Ministries, which recently stopped operating. We look forward to her contributions.

The Pantry is looking for candidates interested in joining the board of directors. The board meets six times per year for about 1.5 hours and takes part in various programs and initiatives to improve the Pantry's work. In June, the Pantry issued a payment of \$4,000 to the Salvation Army to provide housing and utility assistance to referred Pantry clients, using the donation made earlier by the Hands to Help Ministry. One family in the 60641 ZIP code received \$600 in rental assistance in July as the first disbursement. The Pantry will have volunteers working a booth at GIPNA's annual Farmers Market at Independence Park this fall. The semimonthly event lets supporters make donations of food, supplies or money and ask questions.

The Magic After-School Place (MAP) will reopen this fall after more than a year of being suspended due to Covid-19. We can't wait to see how the kids have grown and changed! Rebecca Haneberg will lead the program as Director. Rebecca began working at MAP in 2019 and has extensive experience in child care, having worked at a neighborhood pre-school co-op for 17 years. Rebecca is a long-time Carlson volunteer and a resident of The Villa neighborhood where she has raised five children, the youngest of whom is a freshman in college this year. She will be assisted by Laurie Paliga and Hannah Negray who are eager to get to know the kids and their families.

Now in its 15th year, MAP will serve up to 40 students from Belding and Murphy schools. Our tiered tuition structure and tuition assistance make the program affordable for children from every economic background. In addition to providing a safe place for kids to go after school, we provide structured homework help, group games, clubs, enrichment programs and more, all while following Covid-19 guidance.
