Free Job Training in the Weatherization Field

Albany Park Community Center is now offering paid training for candidates with a building trades background to earn certification from the Building Performance Institute (BPI) to be a home energy auditor and weatherization technician.

“Our training program gives new opportunities for employment or advancement for those with previous building trades experience,” says Hua Chau, director of workforce development at APCC.

This opportunity can especially benefit candidates who have a building trades background in carpentry, engineering, HVAC, electrical, retrofitting, construction, or other related fields, but are currently under-employed or unemployed.

Albany Park Community Center is offering paid training to advance the skills of tradespeople who fall into these categories and will work with participants to help place them in suitable jobs in their fields upon obtaining certification.

Not only is the training itself free, as APCC covers the cost of the certificate, but the program also offers a \$100 a week stipend and a \$116 bonus for passing the course.

“Our number one priority is to get the hard-working candidates in our program a suitable job that matches the skills they have learned through our training,” says project coordinator Casey Smagala.

APCC will be presenting the opportunities in the program to candidates on October 29, 2013 at 1945 W. Wilson, Ste. 3000 at 1:00 p.m. Interested candidates should contact Casey Smagala at 773-433-3250 or email at csmagala@apcc-chgo.org.

APCC has already trained 30 candidates in the Home Energy Auditor course and 15 in the Weatherization Technician class. The center has now begun hosting hiring events for the candidates who obtained the certifications.

The Albany Park Community Center is a not-for-profit, community-based organization that began serving the multi-ethnic Chicago neighborhood of Albany Park and now works with candidates from all over Chicago. The Center operates a wide range of programs and services in Albany Park and the surrounding neighborhoods.

39th Ward Report



HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED how to safely dispose of unused or outdated medicines? After working with the Department of Public Health and the Mayor's Office, I'm pleased to announce that the program recently expanded to all Chicago police stations to allow citywide accessibility for the proper disposal

of expired and unused prescription and over-the-counter drugs. Available 24-hours a day, year-round, Chicago's pharmaceutical disposal program offers a convenient and environmentally friendly alternative to flushing medicines into the wastewater stream or placing them in municipal landfills. The program's main goals are to help prevent unintended or recreational use, reduce, and to keep contaminants out of Chicago's public waterways. Residents of the 39th Ward can drop off pharmaceuticals at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski.

The fall season brings changing colors, shorter days, cooler temperatures, and flu season! One of the best ways to avoid the flu is to get a flu shot. Please stop by my 39th Ward Public Service Office, 4404 W. Lawrence, on **Friday, November 8, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.** to get your free flu shot. In addition to getting a flu shot, Department of Public Health recommends these simple steps to avoid the flu: Wash hands often with soap and water. Regularly clean commonly-touched surfaces such as countertops, tables, doorknobs, telephones and TV/ stereo remote controls. Don't share cups, straws or anything that goes in the mouth. Cover nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing. Stay home when sick.





Have You Been to Cafe Versailles?


