Sunday Adult Bible Study: This fall the Adult Bible Study at Irving Park Lutheran Church is discussing and encouraging the entire congregation to read Sacred Signposts: Words, Water and Other Acts of Resistance by Benjamin Dueholm. Dueholm is a Lutheran Pastor in Wauconda, IL, and will join us on **Sunday, October** 21 for Q & A in the Chapel from 9:15-10:15 am and then will preach during worship. CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 Meeting September 19, 2018

Thank you to Dorie Westmeyer for taking notes at the September meeting.

Attendees: 30 neighbors, 11 police officers, Ald. Rosa's Chief of Staff

Meeting started out with Chandra Libby from the Dept. of Human Services (312-746-5443). Chandra spoke regarding Louie Range and the process they follow with homeless people. If a homeless person is in a pedestrian way her staff (has 2 teams, 5 staff) will go and talk with the homeless person and try to help them with placement, resources, apply for benefits. They will also post a notice that the Dept. of Streets and Sanitation will be coming to remove property. They will visit him weekly for a month. If he is not willing to move then they can't do anything further. Dept. of Streets & San will remove property, clean area. She said it is not illegal for a homeless person to stretch out on public property. But it is illegal if they are impeding the pedestrian way.

A number of arrests have been made in the 17th district for crimes ranging from strong armed robbery, serial armed robbery and drugs and possession of a weapon.

Five incidents in the area around Central Park & Sunnyside involving shootings or shots fired were discussed. (All outside of the West Walker boundaries.) Police stated they are focusing on three areas in the district and the involvement of three different gang territories.

The Third Watch Lieutenant spoke about 17th District resources and strategies to reduce gun crimes. For the last three months, officers have not been pulled to other districts. They must remain in 17. There is a rapid response car as well as TAC teams (undercover), bicycle cops and a sector Sergeant who floats. Lieutenant stated that CAPS officers canvas the neighbors for information when there are reports of shots fired. Residents reported never being asked about shootings when they've reported shots fired.

Officers stated that there are no more shootings this year than prior years. One obstacle to solving gang-related crimes is that gang members don't cooperate with police.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions

Vote in the 2019 Participatory Budgeting Cycle

45th Ward residents aged 14 and older can vote online or in person for the 2019 participatory budgeting cycle. Participatory budgeting is a democratic system that empowers people in determining how their tax dollars are spent.

For those wishing to vote online, simply fill out an online registration form by visiting bit.ly/PBVote2019. My staff will respond with the voting site link and a special access code that will allow you to vote. Please do not share your code with anyone else; your code is unique and may be used only once. Please note that this is not an automated system; rather, office employees will be verifying the information. This may result in a delay from the time you submit the registration from to when you receive the one-time code.


Additionally, there will be ample opportunity for 45th Ward residents to vote in the 2019 participatory budgeting cycle. Those wishing to vote early in-person can do so at my office during office hours at 9 am or at one of the following early voting events:



Long; and 10 am – 1 pm on Tuesday, October 16 at the Copernicus Center, 5216 W. Lawrence. Ward residents will also have the opportunity to receive a free flu shot at this event.



Schurz Part of ACTE Media Tour

On September 19, Schurz was one of seven Illinois schools to be part of ACTE and Illinois ACTE three-day Media Tour. The Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) is the largest national education association dedicated to the advancement of education that prepares youth and adults for careers. Their mission is to provide educational leadership in developing a competitive workforce.

Sarah Rudofsky, CPS's manager of curriculum and instruction for CTE, joined ACTE and IACTE board

members on the tour, along with other school and district administrators.

They visited a digital media class where students produced 30-second video clips promoting local businesses. These professional-quality clips are then used by the businesses in their promotional materials. Also visited were the pre-engineering and auto-tech programs. Last on the tour was Schurz's makerspace, the result of winning a \$20,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Education in the "CTE Makeover Challenge." Schurz was one of ten winners who beat out more than 640 schools for the award.

Many programs use the makerspace, including the entrepreneurship program. In a particularly innovative model, the school hires the entrepreneurship students to use the makerspace to produce the school's gym uniforms, which have cut costs in half. The students also exercise their collaboration skills by working with digital media students to design the uniforms. Other items for sale at the school are also manufactured in the makerspace. Schurz has used its resources wisely and pursued new and innovative opportunities for student growth.

of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, October 19, 2018 at 7:00 pm. If you or a neighbor have been the victim of a crime and you would like to share that information with your neighbors, e-mail the details to westwalkercrimealerts@gmail.com. The exact address of the crime and name of the victim will be kept anonymous.




