WWCA - General Meeting Minutes - February 19, 2008

WWCA President Liz Mills opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

The January General Meeting Minutes were approved.

Bob Begeske reported that the Association had closed an old passbook savings account and transferred those funds into the general account. The WWCA general account reported a balance of \$1,148.80.

Our guest speakers were with Normandy Builders. Dan Schoendorff, Director of Sales and Marketing, and Chris Ebert, Designer, were both on hand to talk about the latest trends in remodeling and build-outs. Normandy originated the Design-Build concept in Chicago in 1979 and has continued to serve the Chicago community since. Dan and Chris walked us through a typical process, from the initial walk through to design and construction phases. Normandy builds year 'round and completed 210 projects in 2007. They also provide post-construction support, including free service on their projects. Dan and Chris were very popular, and answered many questions about a wide array of subjects, from the latest in bathroom accessories (steam showers) to the cost-effectiveness of popular upgrades.

Liz Mills reported that the Art in My Backyard juried art exhibit has received very positive response, with over 20 local artists volunteering submissions. Look for information about the exhibit, to be held in May or June, soon.



CAPS Report

Updates were given on issues brought up at the last month's CAPS meeting.

- Regarding the shooting/homicide that occurred on January 12, the officers reported that the case was still open and there were no new leads. A citizen in the meeting mentioned that they heard a report of someone seeing a male with a red hoodie matching the description by the prior witness and they had a partial license plate number. Officers stated they would follow-up.
- The other old topic discussed was the "dog napping" reports. In the last two meetings, there were reports by residents of a maroon van looking for women walking their dogs. The van stops, knocks down the woman and steals her dog. When the police looked into the reports, they found no record of complaints filed. A victims' rights group also stated they looked into the situation and could not find any victims. It is believed by the police and the victims' rights group that these "dog napping" reports are really an urban myth and are false.

Under new issues discussed:

- At an establishment on the north side of Montrose between Springfield and Harding, over the last couple of months, there have been several noise complaints at closing time, around 2-3 a.m. The officers stated they did talk to the owner and he was very cooperative. The police also stated they have been ticketing anyone parked illegally in the area. They will continue to have a car sitting outside the establishment during closing time as a deterrent.
- Police reported on a several incidents of telephone scams. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE POLICE AND AT&T. DON'T EVER DIAL AREA CODE "809". This scam is being done all over the U.S. This is pretty scary, especially given the way they try to get you to call. Be sure you read this and pass it on. They get you to call by telling you that it is information about a family member who has been ill or to tell you someone has-been arrested, died, or to let you know you have won a wonderful prize, etc. In each case, you are told to call the "809" number right away. Since there are so many new area codes, these days, people unknowingly return these calls. If you call from the U.S. you will apparently be charged \$2,425 per minute. Or, you'll get a long recorded message. The point is, they will try to keep you on the phone as long as possible to increase the charges. Unfortunately, when you get your phone bill, you'll often be charged more than \$24,000. WHY IT WORKS:

The "809" area code is located in the British Virgin Islands (the Bahamas). The charges afterwards can

become a real nightmare. That's because you did actually make the call. If you complain, both your local phone company and your long distance carrier will not want to get involved and will most likely tell you that they are simply providing the billing for the foreign company. You'll end up dealing with a foreign company that argues they have done nothing wrong. If this does happen to you, do make a report with the police, immediately. You will at least have a record of the complaint.

- There was a report, by a resident, of a homeless person being unusually aggressive at the corner of Irving Park and Monticello. Officers indicated there were aware of the person and would continue to monitor.
- Officers reported there had been reports of a purple/ maroon van in the area stealing dogs. The offenders had not been apprehended.
- Officers reported an off-duty officer witnessed two suspicious juveniles on Irving Park just east of Central Park (it should be noted that this is just outside the West Walker area). The juveniles began to etch (aka deface) the side of a building. They were arrested.
- Officers reported several pod cameras had been installed, one at the southwest corner of Drake and Lawrence, one at Lawrence and Kimball, and one on Monticello. Pod cameras installations tend to move every quarter. Locations of the cameras are dependent on the number of 911 calls and are usually decided by the Commander and the Alderman in the area.

Now that spring is almost here, snow will be melting and the rainy season will begin. During this time, some areas may experience standing water on the street. Most standing water is a result of sewers having "vortex" restrictors inside of them. When a large amount of snow melts or rain falls in a brief period of time, the sewers simply cannot handle the excessive amount of water. Once the capacity of the sewer is exceeded, water backs up into the basements of surrounding buildings. The vortex restrictors prevent sewers from exceeding capacity, and as a result, the water remains on the street for awhile instead of flooding basements.


