WWCA to Hold Proposed Residential Project Meeting on November 16

ON NOVEMBER 16 at 7 p.m. there will be a special meeting of the WWCA at the Latvian Center to review and take public comments for a proposed residential development by Tom Lichter and his representatives for his property at 4247 N. Elston Ave. The actual address range is from 4247 to 4259 N. Elston Ave.

The parcel comprises six 25' wide lots and is currently gravel surrounded by a chain link fence. The parcel is zoned C1-1 and the proposed zoning is B2-2. Current permitted uses for each of these zoning designations can be found at www.amlegal.com/library/il/chicago.shtml under "Chicago Zoning and Land Use Ordinance," Chapter 17-3. The Zoning Committee and I have been working with Alderman Laurino's office to review the owner's proposals and work toward compatibility with the guidelines of the West Walker Vision Statement (available on the WWCA website). After numerous reviewed and previously rejected proposals, the Zoning Committee would like to receive public comments regarding the current proposal.

You are highly encouraged to attend this meeting. Your attendance and feedback as residents of West Walker is critical to the evolution of the West Walker that we reside in and the formation of the West Walker that the community wants it to be. Thank you, Neighbor.

Elston Ave. will present plans and details for their project to the community. This special meeting will be dedicated solely to this proposed project, in order to allow sufficient time for the proposal as well as comment and discussion. This project is discussed further on page 1 of the Wire. I would urge anyone wishing to obtain accurate firsthand information regarding this project to attend this special meeting.

Again, your input is very important. Please attend and participate in this process.

Specific Issues Discussed at October 20, 2010 CAPS Meeting for Beat #1723

- Attendees reported suspected drug activity on the 3600 block of Belle Plaine—generally a male with a pit bull—and on the 3700 block of Montrose.
- Attendees reported people (male and female couples seemingly working together) walking up and down streets looking in mailboxes. If you see such activity, please call 911 as well as the postal police.
- Outside the West Walker boundaries, on the 4200 block of St. Louis, there is a man using multi-colored lasers and randomly pointing them at individuals. Attendees reported that this person was shining lights into houses and also taking photos of people, including children. If you happen to see such activity, call 911.
- Attendees reported continued loud, raucous activity on the 3900 block of Montrose (and surrounding streets) on Saturday nights/Sunday mornings generally during the hours of 1-3 a.m. If you experience such activity, please call 911 and provide as much information as possible.

Beat #1723 will continue to have monthly meetings until the end of the year and, because it is such an active beat, it is expected that monthly meetings will continue. Other beats may have bi-monthly meetings with an opportunity to be heard at other beat meetings. Sgt. Barker will likely continue to be the beat officer for Beat #1723. Please continue to attend meetings for Beat #1723 as this may help retain our monthly meetings.

CAPS (Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy) meetings for 2010 for our beat are held at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. monthly on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next meeting is Wednesday, November 17.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity in your neighborhood and provide a detailed physical description of the individuals involved in any incident. Dear Neighbors,

Have you gotten your flu shot? The city's Department of Health will be conducting their free annual flu shots on Wednesday, November 17 in my Ward office (4404 W. Lawrence) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The bad news is property tax bills are due to come out at the end of November. The good news is you might be entitled to a refund if you haven't been taking all the exemptions to which you are eligible. My office conducts one-on-one counseling with property owners to make sure they are receiving all of the tax exemptions they are entitled to. To date, this has resulted in savings of more than \$160,000 to 39th Ward residents. You can find more information about property tax exemptions at the Cook County Assessor's website (www.cookcountyassessor. com). If you would like assistance in applying for property tax exemptions, feel free to call Jonathan in my office at 773.736.5594.

A reminder: City offices will be closed on Thursday, November 11 for Veterans Day. 


