
Also, there are no more scheduled WWCA general meetings until March. Until then, stay warm, stay safe and read the weekly e-mail blasts for updated community information.

CAPS Report

Beats 1722 & 1723 Beat Meeting, December 21, 2016

Present: CAPS Sergeant Peter Kontil, CAPS Officer MaryJane Parks, CAPS Officer Veronica Meraz

A gentleman spoke about new ownership of a bar in Mayfair. The owner of the bar/restaurant was expected, but did not attend.

Sgt. Kontil began the 'old business" portion of the meeting by asking if the neighbors who reported on a trouble building in the 4200 block of Ridgeway were present. Several residents were at the meeting. They reported that the tenants with the gang-affiliated son had moved out a week or two prior to the CAPS meeting. An order of protection was served on the son, and the parents moved shortly after. The order of protection was sought by a neighbor who was verbally threatened by the son. The neighbors reported that it was the actions of their fellow neighbors who called in sightings of the son and any illegal activity observed that got the tenants to leave. According to neighbors, "They knew they were being watched."

Neighbors praised the actions of the police, who came out to the building, talked with neighbors, removed an abandoned vehicle and responded quickly to calls for service. Sgt. Kontil remarked that it is unusual that a situation resolves so quickly. He credited neighbors who worked together, with the help of CAPS, to ensure that their neighborhood didn't become a haven for gang and criminal activity.

No other business in Beat 1723 was discussed. Holiday greetings were exchanged.

As always, call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident.

CAPS meetings for our beat are currently held monthly at the 17th District Police Station, 4650 N. Pulaski, in the Community Room. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour.

I hope everyone in the West Walker community had a very Happy Holiday Season. After the celebrations are over, you can recycle your Christmas tree at North Park Village, 5801 N. Pulaski, from January 3 – January 21. The trees will be chipped and made into mulch, which will be available for residents free of

charge, while supplies last. Please remove all ornaments and lights before dropping off your tree. Decorations, tree lights, wreaths, garlands or household recyclable materials will not be accepted.

The city's Shared Cost Sidewalk Program is an extremely popular program in which homeowners share the cost of sidewalk repair with the City. Thousands of Chicagoans have been a part of this program, taking advantage of the low cost, exceptional value and ease of participation. Senior citizens and those with disabilities may qualify for a further discounted rate.

CDOT will open the 2017 program at midnight, on Tuesday, January 10, 2017. Applicants can begin calling 311 or accessing the city's service request website http://www.cityofchicago.org/311 as soon as the program opens. Participation will proceed on a first-come, first-served basis. The program typically reaches capacity quickly, so you are encouraged to apply early. Please note that if you applied for the program in previous years, you must apply again in 2017.



Irving Park and Addison Blue Line Stations to Receive Public Art Displays

As the final stage part of the Your New Blue renovation program, the Chicago Transit Board awarded contracts to two renowned artists who will commission new public art for permanent display at the Irving Park and Addison Blue Line stations.

The CTA selected two artists from nearly 350 proposals submitted to the agency as a part of a Call for Artists that was issued in February 2016. For the Irving Park Blue Line, they have selected Chicago-based artist, curator, and educator Dan Devening. Internationally acclaimed Italian artist Franesco Simeti has been selected for the Addison Blue Line station.

Devening is currently an Adjunct Professor of Painting at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. Since the mid 1980's, his paintings and works on paper have been featured nationally and internationally. Devening is also the Director of Devening Projects + Editions, a gallery project in East Garfield Park featuring exhibitions and site-specific installations by emerging and established international artists.

Simeti was born in Palermo, Italy and graduated in sculpture at the Academy of Fine Arts in Bologna. He currently lives and works in Brooklyn, NY. Among the most internationally acclaimed Italian artists, Simeti is currently engaged in a number of public art projects in the United States, including the Brooklyn subway stop in New York. He has also made site-specific installations in various museum spaces, including MARCO of Rome, the RISD Museum, Providence, Art & Idea Gallery in Mexico City, and Columbia University of New York.

The CTA will host public meetings with the selected artists to gather community input, which will assist the artists in their development of the site-specific artwork. Meeting details will be announced in the coming months.


